Rules:

- > Rider/horse combination must show in all classes in a division to be eligible for Grand and Reserve
- > Grand and Reserve will **not** be awarded unless there are at least 4 entries in each of the division classes.
- > First Place Prizes will only be given in classes of 3 or more entrants
- > If RIDER has ever shown at 2' or higher, they may only ride in Short/Long Divisions **Unjudged**
- > **Riders may not show in any B Ring Classes or Walk/Jog or Walk/Trot classes in Pleasure Ring.**
- > Professionals are not eligible for year end awards

December and March are Double Point Shows.
Must show 4 of 5 regular season shows to qualify for Year End Awards.

Twin Rivers Saddle Club Membership required to show and/or school.

Warm Up Classes Ribbons only

All Hunter Under Saddle Classes - Open to all ages. To walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. To be judged on performance and way of going, with emphasis on manners and suitability to rider.

All Hunter Over Fences Classes - Open to all ages. To be judged on manners, suitability and way of going.

All Equitation on the Flat - Open to all ages. To walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Rider to be judged on hands, seat, guidance and control.

All Equitation Over Fences Classes - Open to all ages. To be judged on hands, seat, guidance and control.

Short/Long Stirrups Division (107-112) - Open to all ages. To jump a simple course of 6-9 fences at 18". Simple lead changes not to be penalized. May NOT show in B-Ring classes, or any other over fences classes that day. **May Not Show in Pleasure Ring Walk/Jog or Walk/Trot classes. May show in any other Pleasure Ring class.**

Novice Divisions (113-118) Open to Riders that have not won 5 Blue ribbons in classes over jumps at 2' or higher. Ribbons won in these Divisions do not affect your status for the year. Rider may stay in these divisions for the show series. Ribbons won in novice flat classes do not affect status in novice classes over fences. However, ribbons won in novice classes over fences **do** affect rider's status in flat classes. Simple lead changes not to be penalized. To jump a course at 2' (no oxers).

Low Hunter Division (119-121) - Open to all ages including **Professionals/Trainers**. To be shown over a course of 6 to 10 fences at 2'3".

Low Medal (123) - Open to all ages. This is an Equitation class to be shown over a course of 6 to 10 fences at 2'3". There may be a call back test for the top four competitors, at the judge's discretion. USEF Test 1-9

Open Hunter/Equitation Division (125-130) - Open to all ages including **Professionals/Trainers**. To be shown over a course of 6 to 10 fences at 2'6".

TRSC Medal Class (129) - Open to all ages including **Professionals/Trainers**. The Medal Class is an Equitation Test over fences for the intermediate to advanced competitor, following the USEF guidelines for Equitation and Medal classes. There may be a call back test for the top four competitors at the judge's discretion. USEF Tests 1-18

Working Hunter Division (131-133) - Open to all ages including **Professionals/Trainers**. To be shown over a course of 6 to 10 fences at 2'9".

Handy Hunter (133) - Open to all ages including **Professionals/Trainers**. Course may have tight turns, pen type obstacles, hand gallop a jump, trot a lowered obstacle (not to exceed 2'3"), walk an obstacle (not to exceed 18"), halt, back-up, open gate while mounted.

Hunter Derby Rules (400 and 500)

Course requirements: Obstacles must simulate those reminiscent of the hunt field and the course must offer a variety of jumps with different appearances as : natural post and rail, stone wall white board fence or gate, coop, hedge, oxer, brush, logs and natural foliage.

Class will follow hunter format. Because we want to offer this to everyone, if a trainer has the same horse with different riders they will be allowed in the same class. The rider may not go down height division but they may go up. For instance if you are currently showing in 2' you can not show in 18" derby, but someone showing in 18" division may show in the 2' division.

1st round: Horses will jump a course of a minimum of eight jumps at the short/long height or the 2' height. There will be option fences that will be 3" higher than the height and they will receive 1 bonus point for taking the higher option.

2nd round: The top scoring horses of a maximum of 11 horses and a minimum of 4 horses (at show management decision) will return for the 2nd round. The high options will again receive one bonus point and it will be judged as a handy round. The handy options may be as follows: tight turn options, different tracks, clever options for jump approaches , hand gallop jumps, trot a lowered obstacle, execute a walk fence while mounted, lead a horse over an obstacle , halt and/or back. The horses will receive additional up to 10 handy points for their round which will be added to the overall score for this round along with optional higher points.
