<u>Professionals-</u> TRSC is a schooling show and considers a professional rider as an individual who accepts money in exchange for instructing and/or training. Horse and rider combinations who compete regularly at rated shows are also considered professionals.

Schooling-Jumps will be set up Saturday morning and open to schooling from 8am to 9am. There is a separate ring for schooling that will be open all day for riders to warm up and school before their classes.

Novice Division (Previously Pre-Short/Long Division)

The pre-novice division is for riders who are learning to ride a simple course. Trotting will not be penalized. Riders may trot the entire course or trot in/canter out. A consistent pace will score higher than an inconsistent one.

18"-2'6" Divisions

18" Division: Riders are expected to canter the full course, excessive trotting will be penalized. Simple lead changes are acceptable.

2' Division: The rider is expected to canter the full course, excessive trotting will be penalized. Simple lead changes are accepted.

<u>2'3" Division and higher:</u> Oxers will be added in the 2'3" division and higher. Riders will be expected to canter the full course (unless otherwise noted in the pattern) and perform flying lead changes.

<u>Open Division:</u> These classes are open to all riders including professionals. Riders from lower height divisions may not cross enter into open classes.

Equitation- Equitation classes are judged on the rider's position and use of their aids while on the flat or navigating a course of fences. An equitation course will consist of challenging maneuvers such as roll back turns, bending lines, trot fences, etc. These maneuvers are to test the rider's skills and partnership with their horse.

TRSC Medal- An equitation over fences class that may be more challenging than a regular equitation course. Riders may be asked to trot fences, counter canter, or perform a halt.

<u>Hunter</u>- Hunter classes are judged on the manners and movement of the horse. Obedience and relaxation along with a forward pace are sought after in a hunter horse. Over fences, a hunter remains relaxed and forward, maintaining a consistent pace.

<u>Handy Hunter</u>- The handy hunter class is a hunter over fences class that challenges the horse and rider to a course of jumps that resemble what can be encountered in the hunt field. Tight turns and changes of pace can be asked. The horse will be judged on manners and obedience along with the team's consistency and overall appearance.

Open Classes: Open classes are open to any riders within the specified height division. Professionals and green horses may enter open classes. Professionals will not be considered for year end awards.
