B Ring Rules and Class Descriptions

- **Riders in classes 207-214 May Not Enter any other classes in any other rings.**
- **Riders in classes 215-217 May Enter Pleasure Ring Walk/Jog and Walk/Trot Classes ONLY**
- **Riders in B Ring May Not enter any A ring Classes**
- **Classes over 12 riders will be split**

All Pleasure Classes - To be judged on suitability and manners of mount. The appearance of a pleasurable ride should be made by the rider.

All Equitation Classes - To be judged on hands, seat, guidance, and control. Questions may be asked about their mount, attire, or tack

All Hunter Classes - To be judged on suitability to rider, manners of mount and way of going.

Exceptional Riders(201-206) To be eligible for the Exceptional Classes, rider must be identified as having one of the following conditions: Intellectual disability, significant learning disability, delays that require specially designed instruction including: Autism, Down Syndrome, Developmentally Delayed, Fragile X, and any physical disabilities that require additional support, among many others not listed here. The goal of our Exceptional classes is for the inclusion of our riders with a variety of special needs and introduce them to the experience of shows.

Assisted Class - Riders that required a variety of assistance from a trainer or qualified person. Assistance includes, lead lines, side walkers or other physical aids that require a person to be with the rider.

Independent Class - A rider that can safely perform all rides without the aid of a trainer. Trainers may be in the ring for safety but may not give instruction.

Lead Line Division (207,208) Riders in this Division may also enter classes 209, 210 & 211 only. Riders may **NOT** enter classes in any other Division. May be asked simple questions about the horse or tack. Equitation points break any tie for Highpoint. This class is open to English or Western riders.

Walk Off Lead Division (209,210,211) - Handlers allowed to remain in the ring, but assistance to exhibitor will be penalized. Riders that did **NOT** enter lead line (207, 208) may enter Special Walk/Trot (212-214). May be asked to back. May be asked simple questions about the horse or tack. Judge will be looking for a 2 pt. position over the ground pole. Points from the class over the ground pole will break any tie for Highpoint. This class is open to English or Western riders.

Special Walk/Trot Division (212-214) - Entrants may **NOT** enter classes 215-223 or any A Ring or Pleasure Ring Classes. **To Walk and Trot both ways of the ring.** For riders just learning to trot that do not know their diagonals yet. Rider's diagonals will not be judged. May be asked to back. Points from the class over the ground pole will break any tie for Highpoint.

Walk/Trot Divisions (215-217) - Rider may **NOT** enter any A-Ring classes but may enter pleasure ring Walk/Trot/Jog division. To walk and trot both ways of the ring. May be asked to back. Judge will be looking for a 2 pt. position over the ground pole or the 12" X. Points from classes over fences will break any tie for highpoint.

Limited Canter Division (218-220) - Rider may **NOT** enter any A-Ring classes but may enter pleasure ring Walk/Trot/Jog division. To Walk and Trot both ways of the ring. Will be asked to canter one or both ways of the ring. Canter portion will be limited to no more than 4 riders on rail. Equitation points break any tie for Highpoint.

Beginner Hunter/Equitation Divisions (221-226) - Rider may **NOT** enter any A-Ring classes but may enter Pleasure ring Walk/Trot/Jog division. Flat and Under Saddle classes will be asked to walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring. Canter portion will be limited to 4 riders on the rail at one time. May be asked to back. To ride a course of 4 fences at a trot with (2) canter strides after the fence accepted but not recommended. A halt also may be asked after completing the course. Points from flat class will break any tie for Highpoint.

Participants interested in highpoint will pay a highpoint fee (5\$) at time of entry. Highpoint will be closed out to new entries once that highpoint's division has started.

Highpoint will be awarded to the rider with the most cumulated points in that highpoint category. Highpoint participants will receive 1 point for each contestant the rider places above in a class, not all class entries need to be highpoint participants.

Maximum points for a 1st place is 7 points.

*In a class of 3 entries, 1st place will receive 3 points. 2nd place/2 points. 3rd place/1 point.

*In a class of 15 entries, 1st/7 points, 2nd/6 points, 3rd/ 5 points... etc.

Single riders in a class will receive 1 point

A rider can win highpoint by default if they are the only participant in that highpoint.

The same horse/rider combination must be maintained in all highpoint classes to be eligible for that highpoint.
