Rules:

- > Ribbons only in classes with less than 3 entrants.
- > Grand and Reserve will not be awarded unless there are at least 4 entries in each of the division classes.
- > Rider/horse combination must show in all classes in a division to be eligible for Grand and Reserve. In Divisions with 2 classes must show in both classes to be eligible for Grand and Reserve. In Divisions with 3 classes must show in all 3 to be eligible for Grand and Reserve
 - Classes will split if class size exceeds 12 riders.

November & March are Double Point Shows.

Must show 4 of 5 regular season shows to qualify for Year End Awards

B Ring Rules and Class Descriptions



****Riders in classes 201-208 May Not Enter any other classes in any other rings.**

****Riders in classes 209-228 May Enter Pleasure Ring Walk/Jog and Walk/Trot Classes ONLY**

****Riders in B Ring May Not enter any A ring Classes**

All Pleasure Classes - To be judged on suitability and manners of mount. The appearance of a pleasurable ride should be made by the rider.

All Equitation Classes - To be judged on hands, seat, guidance and control. Questions may be asked about their mount, attire or tack

All Hunter Classes - To be judged on suitability to rider, manners of mount and way of going.

Lead Line Division (201,202) Riders in this Division **may** also enter classes 203, 204 & 205 only. Riders may **NOT** enter classes in any other Division. May be asked simple questions about the horse or tack. Equitation points break any tie for Grand & Reserve. This class is open to English or Western riders.

Walk Off Lead Division (203, 204, 205) - Handlers allowed to remain in the ring, but assistance to exhibitor will be penalized. Riders that did **NOT** enter lead line (201, 202) **may** enter Special Walk/Trot (206-208). May be asked to back. May be asked simple questions about the horse or tack. Judge will be looking for a 2 pt. position over the ground pole. Points from the class over the ground pole will break any tie for Grand & Reserve. This class is open to English or Western riders.

Special Walk/Trot Division (206, 207, 208) - Entrants may **NOT** enter classes 209-228 or any A Ring or Pleasure Ring Classes. **To Walk and Trot both ways of the ring.** For riders just learning to trot that do not know their diagonals yet. Rider's diagonals will not be judged. May be asked to back. Points from the class over the ground pole will break any tie for Grand & Reserve.

Walk/Trot Divisions (209-214) - Rider may **NOT** enter any A-Ring classes. Open to Riders with age restriction as specified in class list. To walk and trot both ways of the ring. May be asked to back. Judge will be looking for a 2 pt. position over the ground pole or the 12" X. Points from classes over fences will break any tie for Grand & Reserve.

Beginning Limited Canter Division (215-216) - Rider may **NOT** enter any A-Ring classes. To Walk and Trot both ways of the ring. Will be asked to canter one or both ways of the ring. Canter portion will be limited to no more than 4 riders on rail. Equitation points break any tie for Grand & Reserve.

Beginner Hunter/Equitation Divisions (217-228) - Rider may **NOT** enter any A-Ring classes. Open to riders with age restriction as specified in class list. Flat and Under Saddles classes will be asked to walk and trot both ways of the ring. May be asked to back. To ride a course of 4 fences at a trot with (2) canter strides after the fence accepted but not recommended. A halt also may be asked after completing the course. Points from classes over fences will break any tie for Grand and Reserve.
