B Ring Rules and Class Descriptions

- **Riders in B Ring May Not enter any A ring Classes
- **Classes over 12 riders will be split

<u>All Pleasure/Hunter Classes</u> - To be judged on suitability and manners of mount. The appearance of a pleasurable ride should be made by the rider.

<u>All Equitation Classes</u> - To be judged on hands, seat, guidance, and control. Questions may be asked about their mount, attire, or tack

Exceptional Riders(201-206) To be eligible for the Exceptional Classes, rider must be identified as having one of the following conditions: Intellectual disability, significant learning disability, delays that require specially designed instruction including: Autism, Down Syndrome, Developmentally Delayed, Fragile X, and any physical disabilities that require additional support, among many others not listed here. The goal of our Exceptional classes is for the inclusion of our riders with a variety of special needs and introduce them to the experience of shows.

<u>Assisted Class</u> - Riders that required a variety of assistance from a trainer or qualified person. Assistance includes, lead lines, side walkers or other physical aids that require a person to be with the rider.

<u>Independent Class</u> - A rider that can safely perform all rides without the aid of a trainer. Trainers may be in the ring for safety but may not give instruction.

<u>Lead Line Division</u> (207,208, 209) Riders in this Division <u>may</u> also enter classes 210, 211 & 212 only. Riders may **NOT** enter classes in any other Division. May be asked simple questions about the horse or tack. Points in hack class will break any tie for Grand and Reserve. This class is open to English or Western riders.

<u>Walk Off Lead Division</u> (210,211,212) - Handlers allowed to remain in the ring, but assistance to exhibitor will be penalized. Riders that did **NOT** enter lead line (207, 208, 209) <u>may</u> enter Special Walk/Trot (213-215). May be asked to back. May be asked simple questions about the horse or tack. Judge will be looking for a 2 pt. position over the ground pole. Points from the class over the ground pole will break any tie for Grand and Reserve. This class is open to English or Western riders.

<u>Special Walk/Trot Division</u> (213-215) - Entrants may **NOT** enter classes 216-224 or any A Ring Classes. **To Walk and Trot both ways of the ring.** For riders just learning to trot that do not know their diagonals yet. Rider's diagonals will not be judged. May be asked to back. Points from the class over the ground pole will break any tie for Grand and Reserve.

<u>Walk/Trot Divisions</u> (216-221) - Rider may **NOT** enter any A-Ring classes. To walk and trot both ways of the ring. May be asked to back. Judge will be looking for correct diagonals and a 2 pt. position over the ground pole. Points from classes over ground pole will break any tie for highpoint. Youth riders are riders 17 and younger as of September 1st 2023. Adult riders are 18 and older as of September 1st 2023.

<u>Limited Canter Division-</u>The limited canter division is for riders just learning to canter. The canter portion of each class will be done individually. Participants will walk and trot both directions. Riders may be asked to two point, perform sitting trot, and back up.

<u>Beginner division</u> — The beginner division is for riders who are learning to trot a simple course. Riders will trot the entire course. Excessive cantering will be penalized. Only 3 horses at a time will canter in the flat portion.
