Rules:

- Same Horse/Rider combination entering walk/jog/trot classes 311-316 and/or 335-340 **may not** enter classes 317-329, 331, or classes 343-353 or A ring classes. May enter 301-304, 306-309, 330, 333, 341, and B Ring classes 209-228.
- Professionals entering Horsemanship or Equitation classes must ride without a back number for judge's comment only.
- Professionals are not eligible for Year End Awards.

December and March double point shows.

Must show in 4 of 5 regular season shows to qualify for Year End Awards

High Point will be awarded in Novice, Youth, Adult, and 4-H divisions.

DAILY HIGH POINT RULES: High point will not be awarded unless there are at least 4 entries in each of the performance classes. Must show in a minimum of **3** classes per division to be eligible for High Point. Points from all eligible classes will count towards Daily High Point total.

Pleasure Series Rules and Class Descriptions

Ribbons **ONLY** in classes with less than 3 entrants

Western and English High Point Awards will be given to the Western and English Rider with the most points in Western or English classes during that show. Exhibitors must show in Halter or Model Hunter to be considered.

➤ **The following are the Divisions for High Point of the day and Year End Awards**

Walk/Jog Youth: Must show in 311 and 312. Additional classes to count towards High Point are; 301, 302, 303, 304, 306, 307, 309, 315, 316, 330

Walk/Jog Adult: Must show 313 and 314. Additional classes to count towards High Point are; 301, 302, 303, 304, 306, 308, 309, 315, 316, 330

Western Pleasure Novice: Must show in 317 and 318. Additional classes to count towards High Point are; 301,302, 303, 304, 306, 309, 323, 324, 327, 330 and 331

Western Pleasure Youth: Must show in 319 and 320. Additional classes to count towards High Point are; 301, 302, 303, 304,307, 309, 323, 324, 328 and 331

Western Pleasure Adult: Must show in 321 and 322. Additional classes to count towards High Point are; 301, 302, 303, 304, 308, 309, 323, 324, 328 and 331

Walk/Trot Youth: Must show in 335 and 336. Additional classes to count towards High Point are; 330, 333, 339, and 340.

Walk/Trot Adult: Must show in 337 and 338. Additional classes to count towards High Point are; 330, 333, 339, and 340.

English Novice: Must show in 344 and 345. Additional classes to count towards High Point are; 331, 333, 341, 343, 350 and 351.

English Youth: Must show in 346 and 347. Additional classes to count towards High Point are; 331, 333, 341, 343, 350 and 351.

English Adult: Must show in 348 and 349 . Additional classes to count towards High Point are; 331, 333, 341, 343, 350, and 351.

4-H: Show in any or all classes. 305, 310, 325, 326, 329, 332, 334, 342, 352, 353.

Classes for Horses of a Certain Age: Horse's age is determined as of January 1st 2017.

Grooming: To be shown in hand. To be judged on grooming details and condition. Horses should be of proper weight, properly cleaned and clipped. Will be asked to walk, jog/trot. While in line up horses should be mannerly and stand quietly for Judge's inspection.

Halter Classes: To be shown in hand. To be judged on: way of going, soundness, confirmation, manners, and proper weight. Horses should be groomed to breed specifications. Will be asked to walk, jog/trot and line up. Handlers should be properly attired. Horses are to be shown in a lead shank of adequate length and strength.

Color: Must be color breed (Paint, Pinto, Palomino, Appaloosa or Buckskin). To be shown in hand. To be judged on brilliance of color or contrast. Will be asked to walk and line up.

Model Hunter: To be shown in hand in a bridle with the exhibitor in proper English Attire. To be judged on confirmation, soundness and way of going. Horses under 2 years of age may be shown in halter.

Novice: These classes are for exhibitors who have not won 5 blue ribbons. Ribbons won in this division during this show season do not affect your status for the year. Exhibitor may stay in this division for the whole year.

Showmanship At Halter: To be judged on handler's ability to exhibit the horse to the best advantage. Handlers will be required to demonstrate proper showmanship and safety. May be asked to answer questions asked by the judge.

Walk/Jog & Walk/Trot Classes: Open to riders with age restriction as specified in class list or by novice specifications. Riders to walk and trot/jog both ways of the ring. Riders may ride in B ring classes 209-228 as specified by age restriction.

English/Western Pleasure: To be judged on performance and ability to give a good pleasure ride with emphasis on manners

Equitation/Horsemanship: To be judged on seat, hands, guidance and control of Horse/Pony. Pattern may be asked for by the judge and/or may be asked to back.

Ranch Pleasure Horse: The Ranch Pleasure Horse should reflect versatility, attitude and movement of a working horse. The horse's performance should stimulate a horse riding outside an arena. This class should show the horse's ability to work at a forward, working speed while under control by the rider. Light contact should be rewarded and the horse shall not be shown on a full drape of reins. Overall manners and responsiveness of the horse while performing the maneuver requirements and the horse's quality of movement are the primary considerations.

Trail Novice Rider: This class is an introduction to a Trail class. The class is open to both green trail horse and the novice rider. This class is open to English and Western riders and will only have four (4) to six (6) simple obstacles. It will be judged on the performance of the horse over obstacles with emphasis on manners, response to the rider, and attitude. This class is a walk/jog/trot only.

Trail Open and Ranch Trail: This class will be judged on the performance of the horse over obstacles with emphasis on manners, response to the rider, and attitude. Horse shall be penalized for any unnecessary delay while approaching the obstacles. Credit will be given to those horses negotiating the obstacles with style, providing that carefulness is not sacrificed. Credit will be giving to horses showing capability of picking their way through courses when obstacles warrant it, and willingly responding to rider's cues on more difficult obstacles.

Hunter Hack: To be judged on the flat and over two 12" x rail, or 2'3" fences.
